

**Our number to identify the consent** in ORC's records – it isn't something you need to take much notice of.

This is the **type of resource consent**. It may be a discharge permit (to discharge to land, air or water), a coastal permit (to do something in the coastal marine area) or a land use permit.


**The activity the consent allows you to do.** A consent is required if you wish to do something that is not permitted by district or regional plans or a National Environmental Standard.

**The location where the activity can be carried out.**

**These are called conditions.** The consent holder is responsible for making sure these conditions are complied with. Our compliance team monitors this.

**If you have not used the consent by this date, it will expire.** Think of it as a 'use it or lose it' date. If there is no date specified, the consent will lapse five years after it is issued. You can apply for an extension of the lapse date.

**This is an advice note.** They can remind consent holders of other requirements. Advice notes are legally part of a consent.

**DISCHARGE PERMIT**

**Conditions**

**Specific**

1. This consent commences on the 1st of November 2023.
2. This consent authorises the discharge of contaminants to land at the location and legal descriptions specified above and is limited to the discharge of contaminants as a result of the activity authorised under Land Use Consent RM23.456.02.
3. The discharge to land activity must be carried out in accordance with the plans and all information submitted with the application, detailed below, and all referenced by the Consent Authority as consent number RM23.456.
  - a) Application form, and assessment of environmental effects dated 29 September 2023; and
  - b) Draft Intensive winter grazing management plan, dated 29 September 2023If there are any inconsistencies between the above information and the conditions of this consent, the conditions of this consent will prevail.
4. This consent does not authorise the discharge of contaminants directly to water.
5. The discharge to land activity authorised by this consent must not result in:
  - a) the production of any conspicuous oil or grease films, scums or foams, or floatable or suspended materials;
  - b) any conspicuous change in the colour or visual clarity;
  - c) any emission of objectionable odour;
  - d) the rendering of fresh water unsuitable for consumption by farm animals or; and
  - e) any significant adverse effects on aquatic life.

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This is the **consent number** and it is useful for you to know. RM stands for Resource Management, the two numbers after that are for the year (23 = 2023) the consent was applied for.

**Name of the consent holder.** The consent holder may be an individual, a group of people, a company or a Trust.

**Postal address of the consent holder.** Anyone can apply for consent for an activity on any property, and the consent does not have to be held by the landowner. It's common for a person who holds the lease of a property to hold consents on properties they do not own.

**The purpose or reason for the consent**

**This is the date that your consent ends.** When your consent expires, the activity cannot legally continue. To renew your consent, you should reapply six months before this date.

In any river, lake, artificial watercourse or wetland.

  - a) Once a week at a minimum the Consent Holder must undertake visual inspections of the land being used for grazing to ensure there is no discharge of contaminants to water.
  - b) If there is a discharge to water identified the Consent Holder must immediately notify the Consent Authority and take all practicable steps to stop the discharge to water immediately.
7. The activity authorised by this consent must only be exercised in conjunction with Land Use Consent RM23.456.02.

**General**

8. Under section 125 of the Resource Management Act 1991, this consent lapses two years after the date of commencement of the consent unless:
  - a) The consent is given effect to; or
  - b) The Consent Authority extends the period after which the consent lapses.
9. The Consent Authority may, in accordance with Sections 128 and 129 of the Resource Management Act 1991, serve notice on the Consent Holder of its intention to review the conditions of this consent during the period of three months either side of the date of granting of this consent each year, or within two months of any enforcement action taken by the Consent Authority in relation to the exercise of this consent, or on receiving monitoring results, for the purpose of:
  - a) Determining whether the conditions of this consent are adequate to deal with any adverse effect on the environment which may arise from the exercise of the consent and which it is appropriate to deal with at a later stage, or which becomes evident after the date of commencement of the consent;
  - b) Ensuring the conditions of this consent are consistent with any National Environmental Standards, relevant regional plans, and/or the Otago Regional Policy Statement; and
  - c) Reviewing the frequency of monitoring or reporting required under this consent.

**Notes to Consent Holder**

1. This consent does not authorise access to the land where the intensive winter grazing will occur. Access to the land where grazing will occur must be arranged with the landowners.
