CHAPTER 10- WETLANDS

1. 10.3.1 Objective

My submission is that:

The Director-General of Conservation (the Director-General) requests the following amendments be made to Objective 10.3.1 so that:

- a) The services provided by wetlands are clarified. These services include providing base flows for streams, especially during critical low flow periods and removing silt and nutrients from any water entering the wetland and purifying it before discharge downstream; and
- b) This objective gives effect to section 30(1) (c) (iiia) of the Resource Management Act 1991 (the RMA).
- c) This objective gives effect to the National Policy Statement for Freshwater Management 2011 (NPS for Freshwater Management 2011) in particular Objectives A1, A2, B1, B2, B4 and C1 and Policy C1.

Decision sought:

10.3.1 Otago's wetlands and their values and ecosystem services will be maintained or and enhanced for present and future generations.

2. Policies 10.4.1, 10.4.1A, 10.4.1B, 10.4.2, 10.4.2A. Policy 10.4.6 except 10.4.6 (b) and 10.4.6(e)

My submission is that:

The Director-General supports the amendments made to the above policies as they are consistent with Part 2 of the RMA in particular section 5, section 6(a), 6(b), 6(c), and 6(e), and section 7(a), 7(a), 7(c), 7(d), 7(f), and 7(g). These policies give strong guidance when considering activities within wetlands. By maintaining flows in streams whose source is partially or fully from wetlands these policies also protect the habitat of indigenous fish, of which a number of species are threatened with extinction.

The proposed amendments also give effect to the NPS for Freshwater Management 2011 in particular Objectives A1, A2, B1, B2, B4 and C1 and Policies A1 and C1.

Decision sought:

The above policies be retained with no amendments.

3. Policy 10.4.6 (b)

My submission is that:

The Director-General supports the amendments made to Policy 10.4.6(b) as monitoring of wetland condition is essential to ensure that the Otago Regional Council (the Council) is carrying out its functions under section 30(1)(c)(iiia) of the RMA.

Decision sought:

Policy 10.4.6 (b) be retained with no amendments.

4. Policy 10.4.6 (e)

My submission is that:

The Director-General considers this policy fails to give effect to the NPS for Freshwater management 2011, and in particular Objectives A1, A2, B1, B2, B4, C1 and Policy C1. Accordingly, the Director-General requests the following amendments be made to Policy 10.4.6(e) so that the values of and services provided by wetlands are clarified.

Decision Sought:

(e) Providing information on wetlands and their values ecosystem services.

CHAPTER 12- RULES: WATER TAKE, USE AND MANAGEMENT

5. Rules 12.1.1A.1, 12.1.1A.2, 12.1.1.A.3, 12.1.2.4, 12.1.2.5, 12.1.2.6, 12.1.3.1.

My submission is that:

The Director-General supports the amendments made to the above rules as they are consistent with Part 2 of the Resource Management Act 1991 in particular section 5; section 6(a), 6(b), 6(c), and 6(e); and section 7(a), 7(a), 7(c), 7(d), 7(f), and 7(g). By maintaining flows in streams whose source is partially or fully from wetlands these rules protect the habitat of indigenous fish. These rules also reflect Council functions under section 30 of the RMA.

The proposed amendments also give effect to the NPS for Freshwater Management 2011 in particular Objectives B1, B2, B4, and C1; and Policies B5 and C1.

Decision sought:

The above rules be retained with no amendments

6. Rule 12.1.4.8 and other rules that make reference to now repealed sections 93 and 94(1) of the RMA

My submission is that:

The Director-General notes that within Rule 12.1.4.8 and other provisions reference is made to the now repealed Sections 93 and 94(1) of the RMA.

Decision sought:

Amendments are made to the rules so that s95 of the RMA is referred to where appropriate.

7. Rules 12.2.1A.1, 12.2.1A.2, 12.2.2.5, 12.2.2.6, 12.2.2A.1, 12.2.3.1A, 12.2.3.2A, 12.2.3.4, 12.2.3.5, 12.2.4.1

My submission is that:

The Director-General supports the amendments made to the above rules as they are consistent with Part 2 of the RMA in particular section 5; section 6(a), 6(b), 6(c), and 6(e); and section 7(a), 7(a), 7(c), 7(d), 7(f), and 7(g). By maintaining groundwater which may contribute to or benefit from wetlands these rules protect the habitat of indigenous fish. These rules also reflect Council functions under section 30 of the RMA.

The proposed amendments also give effect to the NPS for Freshwater Management 2011, in particular Objectives A1, A2, B1, B2, B4, and C1 and Policies A1, B5 and C1.

Decision sought:

The above rules be retained with no amendments

8. Rules 12.3.1A.1, 12.3.1A.2, 12.3.2.1, 12.3.2.2, 12.3.2.3, 12.3.3.1 and 12.3.4.1

My submission is that:

The Director-General supports the amendments made to the above rules as they are consistent with Part 2 of the RMA in particular section 5, section 6(a), 6(b), 6(c), and 6(e); and section 7(a), 7(a), 7(c), 7(d), 7 (f), and 7(g). By sustainably managing both the damming and diversion of water maintains wetlands and waterways that both flow both into and out of them, these rules thereby protect the habitat of indigenous fish. These rules also reflect Council functions under section 30 of the RMA.

The proposed amendments also give effect to the NPS for Freshwater Management 2011 in particular Objectives A1, A2, B1, B2, B4, and C1 and Policies A1, B5 and C1.

Decision sought:

The above rules be retained with no amendments.

9. Rules 12.4.1.1, 12.4.2.1., 12.5.1.1 and 12.5.2.1

My submission is that:

The Director-General supports the amendments made to the above rules as they are consistent with Part 2 of the RMA in particular section 5, section 6(a), 6(b), 6(c), and 6(e); and section 7(a), 7(a), 7(c), 7(d), 7 (f), and 7(g). By sustainably managing the discharge of both stormwater and drainage water to wetlands these rules protect the habitat of indigenous fish. These rules also reflect Council functions under section 30 of the RMA.

The proposed amendments also give effect to the NPS for Freshwater Management 2011 in particular Objectives A1, A2, B1, B2, B4, and C1 and Policies A1 and C1.

Decision sought:

The above rules be retained with no amendments.

10. Rule 12.7.1.1.

My submission is that:

The Director-General supports the amendments made to the above rule as it is consistent with Part 2 of the RMA in particular section 5, section 6(a), 6(b), 6(c), and 6(e); and section 7(a), 7(a), 7(c), 7(d), 7 (f), and 7(g).

Decision sought:

The above rule be retained with no amendments.

11. Rule 12.7.1.2

My submission is that:

The Director-General requests the following amendment to Rule 12.7.1.2 as the discharge of pesticide may damage selected indigenous fauna.

Decision sought:

(e) There is no change to the water level or hydrological function, or damage to the flora, indigenous fauna or its habitat, in or on any Regionally Significant Wetland.

12. Rule 12.7.1.3

My submission is that:

The Director-General requests the following amendment to Rule 12.7.1.3 as the discharge of herbicide may damage selected indigenous flora.

Decision sought:

(e) There is no change to the water level or hydrological function, or damage to the indigenous flora, fauna or its habitat, in or on any Regionally Significant Wetland.

13. Rule 12.7.1.4

My submission is that:

The Director-General requests the following amendment to Rule 12.7.1.4 as the discharge of pesticide may damage selected indigenous fauna.

Decision sought:

(e) There is no change to the water level or hydrological function, or damage to the flora, indigenous fauna or its habitat, in or on any Regionally Significant Wetland.

14. Rule 12.8.1.1

My submission is that:

The Director-General supports the amendments made to the above rule as it is consistent with Part 2 of the RMA in particular section 5, section 6(a), 6(b), 6(c), and 6(e); and section 7(a), 7(a), 7(c), 7(d), 7 (f), and 7(g).

The proposed amendments also give effect to the NPS for Freshwater Management 2011 in particular Objectives A1 and A2, and Policies A1 and C1.

Decision sought:

The above rule be retained with no amendments.

15. Rule 12.8.1.2

My submission is that:

The Director-General requests the following amendment to Rule 12.8.1.2 as the addition of such nutrients directly to Regionally Significant Wetlands is highly likely to adversely affect them and so should be subject to some restraints.

Such a change would also give effect to NPS for Freshwater Management 2011 in particular Objectives A1 and A2 and Policies A1 and C1.

Decision sought:

(c) The discharge occurs more than 50 metres from any surface water body, Regionally Significant Wetland, or mean high water springs:

16. Rule 12.8.1.3

The Director-General requests the following amendment to Rule 12.8.1.3 as the addition of such substances to Regionally Significant Wetlands is highly likely to adversely affect them and so should be subject to some restraints.

Such a change would also give effect to the NPS for Freshwater Management 2011 in particular Objectives A1 and A2 and Policies A1 and C1.

Decision sought:

(c) The discharge occurs more than 50 metres from any surface water body, <u>Regionally Significant Wetland</u>, or mean high water springs:

My submission is that:

The Director-General supports the amendments made to the above rule as it is consistent with Part 2 of the RMA in particular section 5, section 6(a), 6(b), 6(c), and 6(e); and section 7(a), 7(a), 7(c), 7(d), 7(f) and 7(g).

Decision sought:

The above rule shall be retained with no amendments.

18. Rules 12.9.1.1, 12.9.1.2, 12.10.1.1, 12.10.2.1, 12.11.2.1, 12.11.2.2 and 12.11.2.3

My submission is that:

The Director-General supports the amendments made to the above rules as they are consistent with Part 2 of the RMA in particular section 5, section 6(a), 6(b), 6(c), and 6(e); and section 7(a), 7(a), 7(c), 7(d), 7 (f), and 7(g). These rules protect wetlands from adverse effects from the discharges detailed in the said rules.

<u>CHAPTER 13 - RULES: LAND USE ON LAKE OR RIVER BEDS OR REGIONALLY</u> SIGNIFICANT WETLANDS

19. Rule 13.2.1.1

My submission is that:

The Director-General requests the following amendment to Rule 13.2.1.1 as the current non-definition of pipes would allow the erection or placement of "pipes" such as tile drains which could be used to take water from a wetland.

Such a change would give effect to Part 2 of the RMA in particular section 5, section 6(a), 6(b), 6(c), and 6(e), and section 7(a), 7(aa), 7(c), 7(d), 7(f) and 7(g).

Such a change would also give effect to the NPS for Freshwater Management 2011 in particular Objectives B1, B2 and B4 and Policies B5 and C1.

Decision sought:

The erection or placement of any fence, pipe (<u>used solely for the carrying of domestic and/or stock water</u>), line or cable over the bed.....

20. Rule 13.2.1.2

My submission is that:

The Director-General requests the following amendment to Rule 13.2.1.2 as the current non-definition of pipes would allow the erection or placement of "pipes" such as tile drains which could be used to take water from a wetland.

Such a change would give effect to Part 2 of the RMA in particular section 5, section 6(a), 6(b), 6(c), and 6(e), and section 7(a), 7(a), 7(c), 7(d), 7(f) and 7(g).

The Director-General supports the amendments made to the above rules as they are consistent with Part 2 of the RMA in particular section 5, section 6(a), 6(b), 6(c), and 6(e), and section 7(a), 7(a), 7(c), 7(d), 7(f) and 7(g). These rules deservingly give Regionally Significant Wetlands the same recognition as the regions' rivers and lakes.

These rules also give effect to the NPS for Freshwater Management 2011 in particular Objectives B1, B2 and B4 and Policies B5 and C1.

Decision sought:

The above rules be retained with no amendments.

22. Rules 13.3.1.1, 13.3.1.2, 13.3.2.1, 13.4.1.1, 13.4.2.1,13.5.1.1, 13.5.1.3, 13.5.1.5A, 13.5.1.6, 13.5.1.8, 13.5.2.1, 13.5.3.2

The Director-General supports the amendments made to the above rules as they are consistent with Part 2 of RMA in particular section 5, section 6(a), 6(b), 6(c), and 6(e), and section 7(a), 7(aa), 7(c), 7(d), 7(f) and 7(g). These rules deservingly give Regionally Significant Wetlands the same recognition as the regions' rivers and lakes.

These rules also give effect to the NPS for Freshwater Management 2011 in particular Objectives B1, B2 and B4 and Policies B5 and C1.

The above rules be retained with no amendments.

23. Rule 13.6.1.1

The Director-General requests the following amendment to Rule 13.6.1.1 as the four species proposed to be included have the potential to adversely effect Regionally Significant Wetland and/or any regionally significant wetland values.

Such a change would also be consistent with Part 2 of the RMA in particular section 5, section 6(a), 6(b), 6(c), and 6(e), and section 7(a), 7(a), 7(d), 7(f) and 7(g).

Such a change would also give effect to the NPS for Freshwater Management 2011 in particular Objectives A1, A2, B1, B2, B4 and C1 and Policies A1, B5 and C1.

Decision sought:

That the following amendments be made to Rule 13.6.1.1

- 13.6.1.1 The introduction of material of the following species:
 - (i) Lagarosiphon major; or
 - (ii) Eel Grass *Vallisneria spiralis*; or
 - (xi) <u>Glyceria species</u>
 - (xii) Alder (Alnus) species;
 - (xiii) Crack willow;
 - (xiv) <u>Gray willow</u>,

To the bed of any Otago Lake....

24. Rules 13.6.2.0 and 13.6.3.1

My submission is that:

The Director-General supports the amendments made to the above rules as they are consistent with Part 2 of the RMA in particular section 5, section 6(a), 6(b), 6(c), and 6(e), and section 7(a), 7(a), 7(c), 7(d), 7(f) and 7(g). These rules enable the maintenance and restoration of Regionally Significant Wetlands. These rules also reflect Council functions under section 30 of the RMA.

Decision sought:

The above rules be retained with no amendments.

25. Rule 13.7.1.2

My submission is that:

The Director-General requests the following amendment to Rule 13.7.1.2 so that the removal or clearance of plant material exotic to New Zealand can not be used as a pretext to damage Regional Significant Wetlands and/or any regionally significant wetland values.

Decision sought:

13.7.1.2 The removal or clearance of plant material exotic to....

(c) The wetland alteration is limited to that which is necessary, the use of best practice methods, for the removal or clearance of the plant material.

26. Rule 13.7.2.1

My submission is that:

The Director-General requests the following amendment to Rule 13.7.2.1 as he considers the four species proposed to be included in this list, as their potential to spread if physically removed inappropriately is at least equal to those species currently listed.

Such a change would also be consistent with Part 2 of the RMA in particular section 5, section 6(a), 6(b), 6(c), and 6(e), and section 7(a), 7(a), 7(c), 7(d), 7(f) and 7(g).

Such a change would also give effect to the NPS for Freshwater Management 2011 in particular Objectives A1, A2, B1, B2, B4 and C1 and Policies A1, B5 and C1.

Decision sought:

13.7.2.1 Except as provided for by Rules 13.7.1.1......

- (i) Lagarosiphon *Lagarosiphon major*; or
- (ii) <u>Eel Grass Vallisneria spiralis</u>; or
- (xv) Glyceria species
- (xvi) Alder (Alnus) species;
- (xvii) Crack willow;
- (xviii) Gray willow,

from the bed of any lake or river, or from.....

27. Proposed New Rule 13.7.2.1A

My submission is that:

The Director-General requests that the following new Rule 13.7.2.1A be adopted in full and applied <u>only</u> to the proposed extensions to the Upper Taieri Wetlands Complex as contained and described (on maps 22, 23, 24, 25, 26, 27 and 28) in Appendix 2 of this submission <u>and</u> to the map describing the extent of the Ida Valley Kettle Holes as contained and described in Appendix 3 of this submission. These areas act as buffer zones for the Upper Taieri wetlands Complex. The Ida Valley Kettle Holes are also collectively significant. The Director-General considers that the Regionally Significant Wetland Values, as described below, of both these areas are not threatened by vegetation removal such as haying.

Upper Taieri Wetlands Complex Regionally Significant Wetland Values:

- A2 Critical habitat for the life cycles of indigenous fauna which are dependent on wetlands;
- A3 High diversity of habitat types;
- A5 Wetland scarce in Otago in terms of its ecological or physical character;
 and
- A8 Regionally significant habitat for waterfowl
- A9 Significant hydrological values including maintaining water quality or low flows, or reducing flood flows.

Ida Valley Kettle Holes Regionally Significant Wetland Values:

- A2 Critical habitat for the life cycles of indigenous fauna which are dependent on wetlands;
- A5 Wetland scarce in Otago in terms of its ecological or physical character;
 and

• A8 Regionally significant habitat for waterfowl

Decision sought:

13.7.2.1A Permitted activity: No resource consent required

- 13.7.2.1A The removal of vegetation by having from both the proposed extensions to the Upper Taieri Wetlands Complex (as contained in Appendix 2) and the Ida Valley Kettle Holes (as contained in Appendix 3) is a permitted activity providing:
- (a) The wetland alteration is limited to that necessary for the removal of hay material;
- (b) All reasonable steps are taken to minimise the release of sediment to the wetland during haying and there is no conspicuous change in colour or visual clarity of the water body.

28. Rule 13.7.3.1

My submission is that:

The Director-General supports the amendments made to the above rule as it is consistent with Part 2 of the RMA in particular section 5, section 6(a), 6(b), 6(c), and 6(e), and section 7(a), 7(a), 7(c), 7(d), 7(f) and 7(g). The rule protects the crucial floral element of Regionally Significant Wetlands. This rule also reflects Council functions under section 30 of the RMA.

Decision sought:

The above rule be retained with no amendments.

SCHEDULE 9: SCHEDULE OF IDENTIFIED REGIONALLY SIGNIFICANT WETLANDS

29. The Schedule of Wetlands

My submission is that:

The Director-General supports both the inclusion and the extent (as shown on the F Series maps) of the following wetlands contained in Appendix 1 of this submission as this scheduling and mapping is consistent with Part 2 of the RMA in particular section 5, section 6(a), 6(b), 6(c), and 6(e), and section 7(a), 7(aa), 7(c), 7(d), 7(f) and 7(g), and this provides protection of many Regionally Significant Wetlands. This schedule also reflects Council functions under section 30 of the RMA. Where the Director-General supports the inclusion of wetlands, but seeks that they be extended in terms of this submission, the wetlands have been <u>underlined</u>.

Decision sought:

That the inclusion and extent wetlands (as shown on the F Series maps) of the attached Appendix 1 be retained without amendment.

30. Additions to the Schedule of Wetlands

My submission is that:

The Director-General considers the wetlands shown on plans contained in Appendix 2 of this submission contain Regionally Significant Wetland values (some of which are noted for individual wetlands) and that this part of his submission is consistent with Part 2 of the RMA in particular section 5, section 6(a), 6(b), 6(c), and 6(e), and section 7(a), 7(aa), 7(c), 7(d), 7(f) and 7(g), and provides protection of many Regionally Significant Wetlands. This Appendix also reflects Council functions under section 30 of the RMA.

Decision sought:

That these be both included in Schedule 9 and their extent (as shown on the plans contained in Appendix 2 of this submission) be shown on the respective F Series maps.

31. Remapping the Extent of the Schedule 9 Wetlands

My submission is that:

The Director-General considers the areas adjoining the wetlands shown on plans contained in Appendix 3 of this submission contain Regionally Significant Wetland values (some of which are noted for individual wetlands) and that this part of his submission is consistent with Part 2 of the RMA in particular section 5, section 6(a), 6(b), 6(c), and 6(e), and section 7(a), 7(aa), 7(c), 7(d), 7(f) and 7(g), and provides protection of many Regionally Significant Wetlands. This Appendix also reflects Council functions under section 30 of the RMA.

Decision sought:

That the extent of the relevant Schedule 9 wetlands (as shown on the respective F Series maps) be amended so that the areas shown on the plans contained in Appendix 3 of this submission are included as part of these Regionally Significant Wetlands.

SCHEDULE 10: SCHEDULE OF ADDITIONAL WETLANDS

32. Movement of Schedule 10 wetlands into Schedule 9

My submission is that:

The Director-General considers that the deleted Schedule 10 Wetlands Site Numbers 80 (Silver Peak Swamp) and 99 (Upper Waipahi River Swamp) do respectively contain regionally significant wetland values and that this part of his submission is consistent with Part 2 of RMA in particular section 5, section 6(a), 6(b), 6(c), and 6(e), and section 7(a), 7(aa), 7(c), 7(d), 7(f) and 7(g), and provides protection of many Regionally Significant Wetlands and the NPS for Freshwater Management 2011. This Appendix also reflects Council functions under section 30 of the RMA.

Decision sought:

That the areas shown on the plans in Appendix 4 of this submission, being the areas in the current Schedule 10 Wetlands Site Numbers 80 (Silver Peak Swamp) and 99 (Upper Waipahi River Swamp), be recognised in Schedule 9 as regionally significant wetlands.

GLOSSARY

33. Addition of definition of "Ecosystem Services"

My submission is that:

In his submissions on objective 10.3.1 and policy 10.4.6(e) the Director-General has sought amendments to better define the services provided by Regionally Significant Wetlands. Such service is commonly defined as "ecosystem services" but as this term is not widely used or understood the Director-General requests that it be defined in the Glossary.

Decision sought:

Ecosystem services: are the benefits that people can obtain from ecosystems.

These include provisioning, regulating, supporting and cultural services.
