Common Mammal and Wildlife ID – Appendix 7

NZ Sea Lion (Male)

Blunt nose, <3.5m in length, 250-400kg, dark coloured fur



NZ Sea Lion (Female)

Blunt nose, <2m in length, 100-160kg, honey coloured fur



NZ Fur Seal

Pointy nose, smaller than Sea Lion, long pale whiskers, body covered in two layers of fur.



Leopard Seal

Large, snake-snake like head. Grey fur, black spots. Males: <3m in length, 270kg. Females: <3.5m in length, 300kg.



Yellow Eyed Penguin

Grey-blue, white belly, pink feet, yellow head band.



Little Blue Penguin

Head and upper body are blue, and white from chin to belly. Flippers and beak are blue. <35cm height, 1.5kg
